





The <u>Group Supplier Code of Ethics</u> (SCE) was approved in 2021, reflecting the Group's ambition to strengthen sustainable cooperation with its suppliers by pro-moting legal, professional, and fair business practices that incorporate environmental, social responsibility, business ethics and governance objectives. The SCE defines minimum standards of business conduct that all Group suppliers are expected to comply with and, if possible, to exceed. To assess the Group's suppliers' compliance with the provisions of SCE, an assessment of compliance with SCE for 2022 was conducted for the first time since the approval of SCE.

The assessment of SCE compliance included gathering information about suppliers' practices, assessing them, and planning improvement actions with a view to strengthen the sustainability aspects of the Group supply chain. **58%** of the invited suppliers responded to the written questionnaire. Information from publicly available data sources was also collected about all suppliers selected for the assessment.

Areas and aspects of SCE assessed

All three areas identified in the <u>Group Supplier Code of Ethics</u> – environmental protection, social responsibility, business ethics and governance – have been selected for the assessment, aiming to assess suppliers' practices and the standards of business conduct they apply. This year, the assessment was mostly focused on the area of environmental protection. Information was also gathered from publicly available data sources to determine whether suppliers are members of international or Lithuanian sustainability promoting organisations, such as the Lithuanian Responsible Business Association, the UN Global Compact, the Lithuanian Diversity Charter Association, and the White Wave Initiative.



Assessment results regarding compliance with SCE provisions

Assessment results show that 93% of the suppliers comply with the requirements set out in the SCE. We would like share our suppliers' achievements in environmental protection, social responsibility, business ethics and governance.
